



## Help our Hope for Haiti Mission



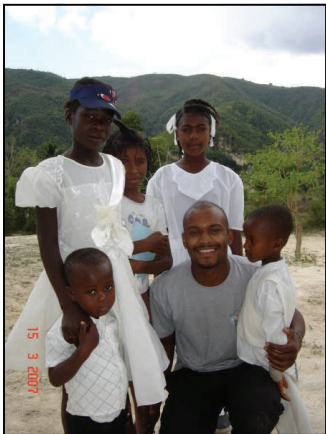
Twenty-two years ago Mother Teresa's Missionaries of Charity in Haiti prayed a novena to St. Joseph for him to send them a lawyer to resolve a conflict that they had with a corrupt importer. The importer was stealing charitable goods that were sent for the nuns.

Precisely on the Feast of St. Joseph, the Mother Superior greeted me as I arrived at their convent with my twin teenage daughters to work with them. When I told her that I was a lawyer, she cried out, "You are an answer to our prayers! We prayed that St. Joseph would send us a lawyer." The other nuns later told me that they had never seen their very reserved Mother Superior so excited.

I resolved their conflict with the corrupt importer and visited their hospital, their orphanage and their nursing clinic. We prayed with them and practiced the works of mercy of visiting the sick, nursing the wounded, feeding the hungry and playing with orphans.

My happy memories of Haiti never left me. So, when the earthquake struck, I was moved to pity to pray for them and to bring them aid, hope and consolation. This is what Jesus King of All Nations asked of us in His message for Haiti.

Jesus said, "*How My Heart weeps for My poor children in the nation of Haiti! Such immense sorrow and death. Such great suffering. I call upon all of My children to pray for these your brothers and sisters and to give them aid in whatever manner possible. Those who have lost their lives in this tragedy are victims of Merciful Love. Johnna, one of the missionaries reported to us that they have suffered from after-quake shocks and much other suffering but that the people are working hard to rebuild and maintain a spirit of joy. Here is a part of her report:

The men here work so hard, it never ceases to amaze me. They work from sun up to sun down, joyfully.

Kendy [one of the orphans] has been so funny lately. He listens so well now I can get him to do almost anything. The other day he pointed to a huge picture of Our Lady, Queen of the Angels that is on our wall. He said, "You," as he pointed to her. I explained no, that is absolutely not me, but that is our Mom. In her arms is baby Jesus, with His arms open to the world. Kendy jumped in my arms and I made him put his arms up like Jesus. Katie [another missionary] and I were dying because he did it so obediently.

During night prayer two nights ago a little girl here, about two years old, didn't want to go to sleep. She couldn't stop laughing. Her mom just let her do whatever she wanted in her joy. One minute she was lying down, and the next she sat up, put both her arms in the air, and started shouting "Alleluia!!" She said it over and over again, all by herself. There are so many people for prayer that the whole front yard was filled, and Katie and I and some others were in the front room of our house, where all the kids get put to sleep. We were lucky enough to witness this. Then this little girl started clapping and saying, "Amen, Alleluia!" I was laughing so hard I couldn't keep it silent. People started looking at me like I was crazy. I literally collapsed on the floor with my whole body, the type of laughter that you need to hold in but absolutely cannot. Every time I think about this little girl I start laughing again. Katie said something along the lines of, "maybe she's having an apparition right now." It was priceless.

We are going to Port-au-Prince tomorrow or Thursday. We're coming back with babies.

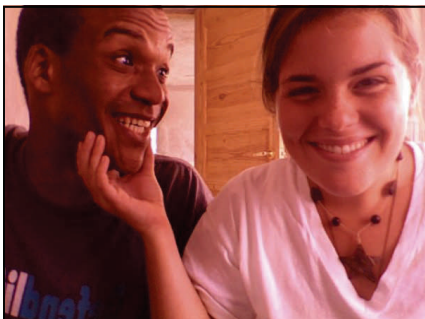
There was a large shake here a few days ago. I was sitting on the back hide-out balcony reading when it started rumbling beneath me. I waited it out, and then waited for Katie to yell. Seconds later Katie screamed my name, making sure I felt it too. I want the ground beneath my feet to be solid. But it's just a reminder that the only place we can fully put out trust is in God.

**Please be a co-worker with God and help us to show them that they have not misplaced their trust in Him!**

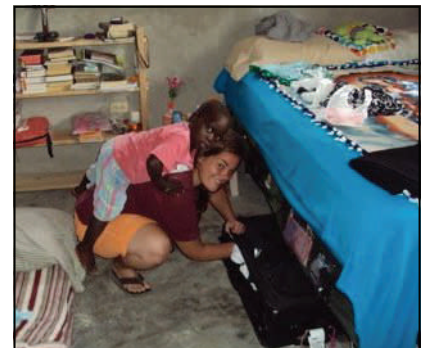
